YOU ARE LOVED | Baptism Sunday Matthew 3:13-17

"¹³Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to John, to be baptized by him. ¹⁴John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" ¹⁵But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." Then he consented. ¹⁶And when Jesus was baptized, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him; ¹⁷and behold, a voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."" (Matthew 3:13–17)

INTRODUCTION:

How would you explain the significance of baptism in the Christian life?

Three key elements of baptism (see Acts 2:37-38):

- 1. Requires Repentance & Faith "Repent"
- 2. Responsibility of the Church to Baptise "... be baptized"
- 3. **Reminds us of what only God can do -** grant the "forgiveness of sins" and "the gift of the Holy Spirit"

DISCUSS:

1.	If baptism represented a person's repentance and desire to turn from sin, why did Jesus submit to baptism under John the Baptist?
2.	What does Jesus mean when He says in verse 15, "Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness."? What encouragement can we draw from the fact that Jesus submitted Himself to baptism, in identification with those He came to save?

3.	When Jesus was baptised by John, a voice that came from heaven saying, "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased." (v17) How does your baptism remind and assure you of God's love?
4.	Jesus' baptism is a fulfilment of the words of the prophet Isaiah in Isaiah 42:1. From this verse, what is one other reason for the Holy Spirit coming upon every believer who professes faith in Christ?
	How does the Holy Spirit help us to continue the work of Christ to fulfil God's mission on earth?
